FAQs

CCTC Industrial Electrician Program

Q: Is the CCTC Industrial Electrical Program found on the EDD's Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL) for TAA and WIA funding for displaced workers drawing unemployment?

A: Yes it is, and you can find the ETPL on the EDD website at - <http://etpl.edd.ca.gov/wiaetpltp.asp>. Enter Construction Craft Training in the Provider Name field.

Q: Should I enroll in the class and then get my approval through the EDD?

A: No! If you start a program prior to being approved for funding, you could lose your unemployment benefits and also have to pay for the training! Make sure you contact your One Stop counselor prior to starting class.

Q: Where do I find out if I am eligible for retraining?

A: Contact your One Stop Center in your county of residence. You can find them listed at http://www.edd.ca.gov/Jobs_and_Training/pubs/osfile.pdf.

Q: Will the TAA or WIA cover all of your training cost?

A: Each county is different and some will pay the entire cost of the CCTC program of \$5800, while others will only pay a set amount. The enrollee is responsible for any tuition not covered by your funding source. The excess can be spread into 6 monthly payments.

Q: Is the CCTC approved to accept Pell Grants or the GI bill funding?

A: No not at this time!

Q: What is the starting wage after completion of the CCTC's Industrial Electrician?

A: \$18-\$25 per hour.

Q: What is the schedule for the Industrial Electrical Program?

A: Monday through Thursday from 7am until 1 pm for 576 hours or 24 weeks of training.

Q: Where is the Industrial Electrician Course held?

A: This class is held at both of CCTC Facilities - Hayward located at 26200 Industrial Blvd. 94545, and the Turlock Facility located at 2480 Acme Court, Turlock, Ca. 95380
